



2008 Cub Derby Games
Indian Lake Park, Tarboro
August 23, 2008



What: A fun-filled day on Saturday which will include soapbox derby races, a fishing derby, sailboat regatta races including arts & crafts, an obstacle course, and water games for scouts, leaders, and their families. Packs and families may camp on Friday and Saturday night.

When: Camping begins on Friday, August 23 with day camp events on Saturday as well as camping out again Saturday night. There will also be a Sunday Morning Interfaith Service.

Where: Indian Lake Park, US 64 Alt., Tarboro.

Cost: The cost is \$10.00 per scout and registered leader. Registration includes lunch and a patch. Adults and siblings who wish to camp must pay a \$2.00 registration fee. If an older child is attending and wishes to participate they need to be registered and pay a \$10.00 registration fee as well.

Cub Games, Saturday August 23rd

The purpose of Cub Games is to allow scouts and their families a great fun-filled campout and day camp experience. On Friday scouts and their families will have a chance to begin setting up for camping out. Anyone who camps on Friday it's a fend-for-yourself kind-of night. On Saturday we'll have a fun-filled day of Cub Derbies and Games. After games conclude on Saturday awards will be presented and there is a chance for families to stay for Pack Tug-of-War and another night of camping. On Sunday morning we will have an Interfaith Service at the Campfire Site and we will then dismiss for clean-up.

Camp Set-up – Begins at 3PM on Friday for anyone who would like to establish a camp site early. We encourage packs to camp together to establish a neater camp area. Please feel free to mark an area for your pack. Only the fire pits that are at the camp site may be used to build fires in. There can be no digging for fire pits. Fire bowls are allowed as well as grills. You may drive your vehicle back to the camp site area for unloading. However, vehicles must be parked back at the entrance and in the designated overflow areas. If your pack is one of those fortunate packs that has a trailer you may leave those at the campsite.

Registration- Registration will be set-up at the main building at the lake entrance. We will have access to the building on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday morning. This will also be designated as our First Aid area. Registration for this weekend will begin at the end of April. Please register with the council office in Kinston using one of the applications. Scouts and registered leaders can register for a fee of \$10.00. This cost includes your patch and lunch. Adults and siblings may attend at no cost. If you have an older tagalong who would like to participate and receive a patch they will need to pay the \$10.00 registration fee as well. However, adults and siblings who plan to camp then they must pay \$2.00 per person. All scouts will receive a wristband to signify them as part of the event due to this being a public park.

Events- Events will run for 45 minutes during a 1 hour time period. There will be 15 minutes allowed to get to your next event. There will be 1 hour ½ for lunch. The following events will be offered: Soapbox Derby Race, Sailboat Regatta Race, Fishing Derby, Obstacle Course, and Water Games. The events will be judged so that dens may receive awards at the end. The obstacle course will be set-up with things like a tunnel, over-and-under, tires, a cross-over, and more. Water games will include a dunk tank where the kids will have a chance to dunk a leader. Therefore, find a willing leader for you pack. The soapbox derby will include cars where one scout will navigate while the other scouts push from behind in a race. All of the soapbox derby cars will be provided. The Sailboat Regatta Race will include a chance for the scout to make and race their own sailboat. The gutters and supplies will be provided. Lastly, the Fishing Derby will give the scouts a chance to see which pack can catch the most fish, the least fish, the biggest fish, and the smallest fish. All of the rods, cane poles, and bait will be provided. A

Wildlife Commissioner will be at the camp to teach the boys the proper way to bait their hooks. Look ahead at the fishing belt loop requirements. If a scout would like to bring their own rods and bait they may. At each of these stations we will have water coolers and cups for hydration. We encourage you to encourage your scouts to bring a sports bottle to maintain constant water intake. At as many of these events we will try to have tents for shade. We also encourage you to let the scouts wear clothing that is appropriate for water games and tug-of-war. As well leaders may need changes of clothes. We are encouraging leaders to participate with the kids in events.

Lunch/Hike - Lunch will be served by the OA and may be purchased for \$2.50 for a hotdog, chips, and a drink. The Town of Tarboro will also have a concession open to purchase snacks and drinks. We encourage you to pack plenty of water and drinks to keep well hydrated. As well remember to encourage your scouts to pack snacks. There will be 1 hour ½ for lunch. During this time packs may hike on the nature trails and learn signs for “Finding the Way” as well as leaf and tree identification. Look at the requirements for the hiking belt loop.

Dinner/Supper- Each pack , family, or individual needs to be responsible for their own dinner. We will not have dinner for sale.

Pack Tug-of-War – We will have a tug-of-war challenge for anyone who would like to participate after dinner. Please be sure to be prepared with the appropriate clothing.

Community Campfire- We will have a community campfire program at the end of the evening at the main fire pit in the camp site area. Be ready for to join in for songs. If you have a skit that you would like to perform please call Tina Parker at 544-0219 to get the content approved. Lights out at 10PM.

Sunday Morning Service- There will be an Interfaith Program at 8:00AM on Sunday Morning at the main campfire pit. After service is over everyone will be dismissed for camp clean-up. Remember while we are there we will be practicing Leave No Trace.
